If your son/daughter has a medical condition please complete the **Ross Sheppard Medical Condition Alert Form** online. You can access the form on **SchoolZone** under the “school news” tab. Locate the heading "Medical Management Plan" and follow the link. * You will be required to fill out this online form between August 25 and September 15 each year your child attends an Edmonton Public School; as it does not carry over from year to year.

-4 Knowledge and Employability Stream (K&E)

-4 Knowledge and Employability (K&E) courses are available to Ross Sheppard students in grades 10 through 12. The courses provide students with opportunities to experience success and become well-prepared for employment, further post-secondary studies, engaged citizenship, and life-long learning.

The attitudes, skills, knowledge, and workplace competencies found within the various -4 Knowledge and Employability Courses are aligned with other grade-level programs of study. These courses are intended to maximize opportunities for student success and to support high school completion. Students who complete the program are given a **Certificate of High School Achievement**. Students demonstrating strong self-advocacy, excellent attendance, and strong academic knowledge, skills, and attitudes may transition to courses that will contribute to the completion of a High School Diploma if and when appropriate.

Pre-enrolment in SchoolZone for 2019 - 2020

Parents of current district students can select their preferred school for 2019-2020 by signing in to their parent SchoolZone accounts beginning Monday, March 11 at 9:00 a.m. until Monday, April 15 at 4:00 p.m.

When parents sign in to their parent account, they can:

- choose the “Next Year” tab
- select the name of the child they are pre-enrolling
- follow the instructions to select their child’s preferred school for next year
- change the preferred school selection until **4 p.m. on April 15, 2019** (SchoolZone will track each change)



Course Selection in OSCR

Course selection is **NOT** part of pre-enrolment in SchoolZone. Junior high and High school students will choose their specific courses (e.g., fine arts, career and technology studies) through a separate process at their current school.

Address Verification

Please make sure that your child’s current school is aware of any address changes for your child. Schools may ask parents to provide more than one form of documentation to verify their address. Examples of accepted documentation include:

- utility bill
- lease agreement
- property tax bill
- driver's license

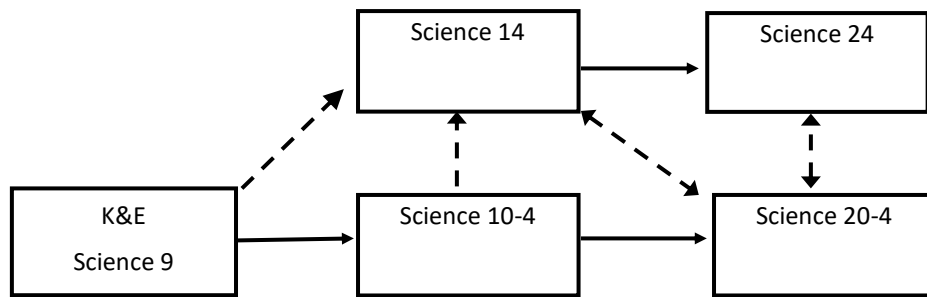

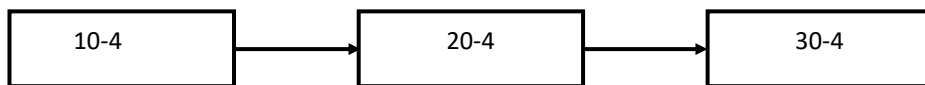

When selecting -4 K&E (Knowledge and Employability) courses, it is critical that students, and parents/guardians are well aware of the flexibility and transition points between -4 K&E courses and to other course streams. Strong course articulation ensures that students have every opportunity to acquire a Certificate of High School Achievement or to transition to other courses to achieve an Alberta High School Diploma.

Transitions to and from -4 K&E courses are made through consultation with the student, parents/guardians, teachers, and others as appropriate and on an individual student and course-by-course basis, with specific focus on attendance and pre-requisite course completion marks.

-4 K&E courses are designed for students who:

- demonstrate reading, writing, mathematical and/or other levels of achievement two to three grade levels below their age-appropriate grade.
- have expressed goals that include succeeding in school to become better prepared for the workplace
- achieve success through experiential learning activities that require focus on reading, writing, mathematical literacy, and employability skills in occupational contexts
- have demonstrated and/or expressed a desire to enter the workplace after completing a Certificate of High School Achievement **or** require a more gradual and supported approach to working towards and achieving an Alberta High School Diploma
